Sal started her career as a Civil Servant working on Children's Policy in Westminster and New South Wales, Australia. She has authored a range of influential policy reports relating to the importance of the earliest years of life and issues affecting families during that time.

Kath qualified as a registered nurse in 1977 and moved into nurse education in 1985, teaching psychology and counselling at the University of Sheffield for 16 years. She graduated with a BSC (Hons) degree in Nursing and Education in 1992 and attained a distinction in a master's degree in counselling studies in 1995. Kath has since specialised as a Child and Adolescent Therapist and

has been running weight management programmes for children and young people since 2003. Her pioneering programme called SHINE focuses on the 'real life' experiences of young people and explores the psychological reasons which often underlie disordered eating patterns. SHINE is an award winning programme winning several best practice awards, the Pride of Britain Best Community project, best research presentation at the Obesity Conference in Cape Town, South Africa and more recently featured on a BBC Panorama Documentary.

Sarah Robertson: Dental Public Health Consultant NHS England & Improvement



Sarah Robertson is a Consultant in Dental Public Health, and has worked in Dental Public Health for 16 years initially in PCTs, and then Public Health England before transferring to NHSE&I. She currently supports NHSE&I in the commissioning of dental services to reduce inequalities in oral health. Outside the office apart from being a chauffeur for his two teenage children, Marcus has a love for all things sports, including following Liverpool FC and playing tennis.



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


